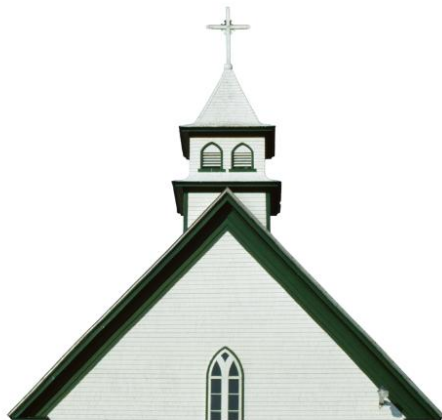

Pastor's Story

A Journey of Faith, Music, and Ministry

Born in Virginia and raised in the Baptist Church, Pastor September Penn has been immersed in ministry for as long as she can remember. Her life's work has spanned a variety of ministry contexts and denominations, shaping her into a dynamic and adaptable servant leader. Her ministry journey began on the East Coast — serving in Virginia, Maryland, Washington, D.C., and Florida — before God led her west to California.

Much of Pastor Penn's ministry has reached beyond the traditional church walls. ***Together with her husband, she co-leads The Power of Song, Inc., a nonprofit organization that uses music and the arts to inspire, educate, and unite communities.*** Through large-scale productions and intimate ensemble performances, their work has touched lives across the United States — from Florida to California — and internationally in Jerusalem, Japan, and Africa.

When Pastor Penn submitted to the pastoral call, she was led to connect with the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). Though she had served in several denominations, she was drawn to the Presbyterian Church's thoughtful approach to governance and accountability. The PC(USA) ordination process was both rigorous and refining — involving extensive interviews, theological coursework, examinations, and public evaluations.

It was during one of those public examinations that Angeles Mesa Presbyterian Church first heard her speak. Impressed by her authenticity and spiritual depth, they invited her to preach. What began as a series of guest sermons soon grew into a pastoral internship — *and ultimately, her first official pastoral call.*

Today, Pastor Penn continues to serve with vision and grace, leading her congregation in worship, community engagement, and Kingdom impact.
